

## History - Suffragettes

1. The aim of the NUWSS was to protest peacefully to achieve their goal of gaining the right to vote for women. Some tactics which they used were working with politicians (men), writing letters to newspapers and MPs, and producing leaflets.
2. The WSPU were different to women's suffrage organisations before them because they were not peacefully protesting, they organised events that got them publicity for their cause. WSPU also did dangerous acts like chaining themselves to railings in order to put their campaign on the front pages of newspapers and stand out.
3. The WSPU was founded in 1903 because the protesters before (NUWSS), although trying, did not succeed so the WSPU wanted to change that.
4. The 'deeds not words' motto means to do the work themselves as before the goal had not been achieved.
5. The WSPU did surprising and shocking acts in order to try to get people's attention and understanding of how badly they wanted the right to vote. For example, they disrupted political meetings, chained themselves to railings, and destroyed properties.
