Magistrates' Court Mock Trial Competition (12-14yo)

In September I will once again be looking for students to put together a team of Persecution and Defence Lawyers, Magistrates, Defendant and Witnesses! Come and join us in Mock Trials!

What is it?

The Magistrates' Court Mock Trial Competition helps young people understand how the law touches every aspect of their lives, gaining an insight into how the legal justice system works.

Students who wish to join us in defending and prosecuting in a case, in the Hereford Magistrates Court, will be given access to resources, including a specially written criminal case, to help teams prepare legal arguments. After preparation, your team will take part in a local heat and go head-to-head with other schools to prosecute and defend the case. The first round of winners will then compete in a regional heat with a new case.

Winning teams from regional heats will battle both cases out at a National Final. Last year we came entered for the first time in a number of years, winning, the prestigious Rotary Plate for third place (an amazing achievement for a first time entry!) and the Magistrates' Association Cup for best team of magistrates. Since last November, 29 pupils across KS3 have attended Jamie's Farm, Dulas, Hereford. The programme was originally designed as a residential programme, however we were lucky enough to secure day visits to the farm over a 6 week course.

The therapeutic farm opens its doors, barns and fields to vulnerable children immersing them in farm life whilst receiving tailored therapeutic support. Jamie's Farm has built the up the student's trust and self-confidence, helping them to grow and learn about themselves. Pupils that disliked school

or were on the verge of exclusion were able increase their engagement with school and find themselves succeeding. We are really thrilled to learn that one of our students has just been chosen across England and Wales to become one of sixteen Jamie's Farm Ambassadors. This is a really exciting opportunity for him and one of responsibility. We wish him all the very best. Cricket — **Emerging Player Programme**

Last year Herefordshire cricket was successful in applying for some England Cricket Board funding to run an Emerging Player Program, this is an integral element of the County Talent Pathway. It provides individualised programmes of support (coaching, conditioning, nutritional advice, etc.) to a small number of players aged between 13 and 16. Its aims are to augment the County Age-Grade playing programmes, to develop the core foundations of future performance, to provide a bridge into Worcestershire County Cricket club academy system and to feed into the Herefordshire County Cricket club 1st X1.

We asked the county age group coaches to nominate their most successful players, we had thirteen players attend the trials and six were eventually selected to attend the program. One of whom is our own Ollie Langford. The selected boys have had three hours every Monday evening from the end of October, delivered by myself and Andy Sutton from Worcestershire County Cricket Club,. Richard Skyrme, Head of Performance.

U15 Cricket

The U15 team won the County Plate Final, beating Lucton School by 35 runs.

After scoring 148 with the bat, Xander (42) and Will Smith (25) top scoring, the boys started well in the field.

Things soon became a lot tighter after the midway point but, up step Man of the Match Will Smith, taking 5 wickets for 10 runs in his spell to help swing the tie Kingstone's way, allowing the team to reduce Lucton to 113-8 from their 20 overs.

A great afternoon of cricket, with the Herefordshire County Cricket representatives commenting on "the tremendous spirit, teamwork and maturity" demonstrated by our boys.

The Year 7 and 8 cricket team were successful and won the county trophy beating St.Mary's.
